2010 FRUIT

APPLES

Cortland- Dark red skin, medium sized apple. Crisp pure white flesh resists browning when cut. Good all purpose apple for fresh or cooked use. Ripens late September. Pollinate with Macoun. Semi-Dwarf (12-15'), Zone 4.

Fuji- Light green skin with red blush. Sweet, crisp and juicy, ripens in October. Stores well. Pollinate with any mid-season blooming apple. Semi-dwarf (12-15'), Zone 5.

Macoun- A New England favorite. High quality, dark red, firm fruit. Considered by many the best overall apple for fresh eating. Pollinate with Cortland or Red Delicious. Semi-Dwarf (12-15'), Zone 4

Red Delicious- Cherry red, elongated apple. Sweet flavor, juicy flesh. Resistant to fireblight and cedar rust. Ripens early October. Pollinate with Honeycrisp. Semi-Dwarf (12-15'), Zone 5.

Granny Smith- Bright green apple tinged with pink. Great for eating and cooking. Perfect for salads as they will not brown as quickly as other apples. Fragrant, white blooms in spring. Semi-Dwarf (15'), Zone 5.

Johnathan- Bright red, sweet and juicy. Good for eating, cooking and freezing. Ripens early October. Pollinate with Red Delicious or Fuji. (25'), Zone 4.

PEACH

Reliance- Yellow skin with a red blush. Yellow flesh is soft and juicy. Very hardy. Ripens mid-August. Self-pollinating. Freestone. Dwarf (8-10'), Zone 4.

PEAR

Bartlett- Vigorous, productive tree that bears fruit at a young age. Fruit is large, golden yellow and highly flavored. Ripens late August. Pollinate with D'Anjou'. Semi-Dwarf (12-15'), Zone 5.

D'Anjou'- Light green with slight brown russeting. Smooth white flesh. Superb flavor. Keeps well in storage. Ripens mid-September. Pollinate with Bartlett. Semi-Dwarf (12-15'), Zone 5.

Lucious- Fragrant pink/white flowers in spring. Beautiful red fall foliage. Medium to small, bright yellow fruit. Good for fresh eating and desserts. Ripens mid-September. Pollinate with Bartlett or D'Anjou. (25'), Zone 5.

SWEET CHERRY

Stella- Large, heart shaped, dark red fruit. Sweet rich flavor. Moderate crack resistant. Self pollinating. Can pollinate other sweet cherries. Semi-Dwarf (15'), Zone 5.

Black Tartan- Heavy bearer of bright, purplish-black fruit. Rich and juicy. Golden color in fall. Needs pollination from any other sweet cherry. Semi-Dwarf (15'), Zone 5.

Lapin- Sweet and juicy fruit harvested in mid to late July. Great for eating fresh, baking and preserves. Self-fertile but makes a good pollinator for other trees. (20'), Zone 4.

Bing- America's favorite cherry! Large, meaty, heart shaped fruit is very sweet. Needs pollination from Stella, Lapin or Black Tartan. Semi-Dwarf, (15') Zone 5.

SOUR CHERRY

North Star- Light red skin with red flesh. Produces heavy crops and is disease resistant. Very hardy. Good for pies and preserves. Ripens mid-June. Self-pollinating. Dwarf (6-9'), Zone 4.

PLUM

Santa Rosa- Purplish red skin. Firm amber flesh. Great for canning or fresh eating. Ripens mid-August. Self-pollinating. Japanese variety. Dwarf (10-12'), Zone 5.

Shiro- Juicy, dark yellow plums. Perfect for eating right off the tree. Ripens mid-July. Self-pollinating. Japanese variety. Semi-Dwarf (10-12'), Zone 5.

Burbank- Large, bright reddish-purple fruit is sweet and juicy. Good for eating fresh or making jelly. Ripens July through Aug. Pollinate with Santa Rosa or Shiro. (25'), Zone 5.

APRICOT

Moorpark- Large yellow fruit is sweet and juicy. Good for eating fresh, canning or drying. Ripens July-August. Self-pollinating but it is recommended to plant two or more for a better crop. (20'), Zone 4.

NECTARINE

Fantasia- Pink flowers turn white in spring. Tasty fruit is large, firm and tangy. Later harvest is much sweeter. Ripens July-August. Self-pollinating, needs thinning and pruning for decent crop. (12'), Zone 5.
